No-Bake No-Cook Dessert Jar

The first thing we think of when we say sugar is DESSERT! Let's make jar filled with all things yummy and dive in.

• 1 tablespoon sugar

*Adult assistance required for this activity.

Things you need:

- 3/4 cup fresh cream
- Dessert jar or glass
- 3/4 cup chocolate sauce
 - 2 cups crumbled bread or pounded biscuits
- 1/4 cup water

Steps to follow:



Spoon

1. Put about 4-6 tbsp of the crumbled bread or pounded biscuits in the glass.





3. Add 4-5 tbsp fresh cream and sprinkle with sugar.



5. Repeat this process till the glass is full to the brim. Refrigerate for about half hour. Your jar of sugary goodness is ready to dive in!

Things you need:


- Water colours

- Glitter (optional) Sugar water solution (3 spoons sugar, 2 spoons of warm water)

Steps to follow:





1. Draw a mandala art on an art sheet with pastel crayons. Ensure not to draw too intricate design.

2. Mix the sugar with water and stir until it has dissolved.



3. Apply the sugar mixture over the printable.






Cane to Cube

How does the long sugarcane turn into the sweet little cubes we have at home? Revise the journey of sugar by matching each process with the correct description.












Syrup is cleaned using hot water and lime water.
