We have listed a few words related to an ice lolly. Separate them in the correct sense column and learn different ways of describing it.



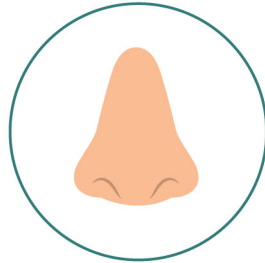
