HOW TO PLAY

The set contains 15 cards in 4 categories:

• Character • Setting • Emotion • Object

PLAY ALONE

Pick one card from each of the 4 categories and get started with making your story incorporating the 4 elements: Character, Setting, Object and Emotion! You can even write your story in the book provided and cherish your early creations!



PLAY TOGETHER

OPTION I: ONE PLAYER - ONE STORY

- Shuffle each deck and place it in four piles, face down.
- Each player picks one card from each category character, setting, object, and emotion.
- The player creates a story using all the four cards picked and shares the story with the group.
- Each player continues in a similar manner.

OPTION 2: BUILD ON

- Shuffle all the cards together.
- Distribute the cards, up to 5 cards per player.
- The first player opens any one card from his or her hand and starts the story.
- The next player builds on and adds a chapter to that story by opening any one card from the hand.
- The story can go on until all players finish using their cards, or it can end with each round with one turn per player.

WRITE IT DOWN

After creating your own story, write it in the book. The book is designed to help young learners understand story structure as they pen down their creations.
